




North Atlantic right whales are one of the most endangered of all the Earth's whales. These massive marine mammals swim close to shore and float when killed which made them the "right whale" to hunt. Whaling started in the 9th century in Norway. It is believed North Atlantic right whales could live to be 100 years old. Humans are the only threat to these awesome creatures which are 50 feet long and 20 feet tall. North Atlantic right whales were hunted for their blubber




which was made into oil which fueled the European colonization of North America. Their baleen and bones were used to make women's corsets and hair combs. Whaling was outlawed in 1935 and only 100 whales remained. The population seemed to come back but now the whales are dying from being hit by ships and entangled in the ropes used for fishing and lobster traps. The 50-ton whales eat tiny crustaceans which are becoming hard to find because climate change is changing their habitat.




North Atlantic right whales are mysterious creatures. It was only recently discovered where the whales give birth to their babies. In 1979, the Navy began construction of Kings Bay nuclear submarine base in the Cumberland Sound on Georgia's coast. In 1982, a dead baby North Atlantic right whale washed ashore on Little St. Simons Island in Georgia. Scientists began to investigate and in 1985 it was discovered that pregnant North Atlantic right whales migrate to Georgia each




winter to give birth in the Cumberland Sound! The North Atlantic right whale was adopted as Georgia's official State Marine Mammal. It is estimated that only 350 North Atlantic right whales remain today. People are working to save the North Atlantic right whales and NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) is trying to get boats to slow down and watch for whales and to get fishermen to change the way they trap and hunt lobsters and fish.





Susie King Taylor is Liberty County's own Heroine of Freedom and Literacy. She was born on the Isle of Wight in 1848 where her family was enslaved. Susie's grandmother Dolly encouraged her to read and write and she was given secret lessons by a free woman in Savannah. At age 13, Susie escaped to freedom with her uncle to join the U.S. army occupying Fort Pulaski near St. Simons Island. Susie was a field nurse in the Civil War and her serviceful life is especially celebrated for the many



adults and children she taught to read and write! Hermina Glass-Hill is Liberty County's Heroine of History. She is a nationally recognized scholar of Susie King Taylor and moved from Atlanta in 2018 to establish the Susie King Taylor Women's Institute and Ecology Center in Hinesville. She won the Governor's Award in Arts and Humanities for preserving African American history. She created the displays at the Dorchester Center in Midway. She is also a Georgia field representative for Oceana!












The United Nations was formed in October 1945 two months after World War II ended and the U.S. bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki launched the Atomic Age. The U.N.'s mission is to maintain international peace and security. The history of the United Nations is still being written. In 2021, the U.N. Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons entered into force of international law. The treaty has been signed by 92 nations and ratified by the governments of 68 nations. None of the nine nations which possess nuclear weapons has signed the treaty. The United Nations has outlawed chemical weapons, biological weapons, land mines and nuclear weapons testing.
